

June 3, 2023 - A Blind Dish does mean a Bad Signal...

Last month I did talk about how our dish radio systems need a clear line-of-sight to our transmitter to receive a strong signal.

In the past couple of weeks I have received calls from some of our radio dish system clients saying they have lost Internet performance. In the past couple weeks we have noted a surge in plant growth as well...

Although an extreme example, the photo shows a Direct TV dish on the edge of my property that two years ago had a clear line of site to the sky location of the satellite transmitter and now is hidden in the forest!



I know that with our terrestrial dish radio system the line-of-sight can be blocked by a close in bush or a newly leafed out maple tree limb 100 feet away. This is something that home owners can solve themselves...

Summer is a time when we all make improvements on our properties. If you are a Fiber To The Home (FTTH) client as you work around your lot remember where our Fiber cable is located and avoid trenching where it is buried. If your line is coming into your house overhead, be careful with tree trimming not to break that Fiber line overhead...
